RESERCH TOPIC and AIMS


Assessment of the Quality of life of children and adolescents with type 1 diabetes mellitus based on modern methods of insulin therapy.

AIMS

- 1. To assess and compare the quality of life of children with type 1 diabetes mellitus that are in the state of intensified and pump insulin therapy.
- 2. To study the role of insulin therapy in achieving the compensation of type 1 diabetes in children with different methods of insulin therapy.




We have conducted a questionnaire on quality of life of patients with DM1 type while using pump insulin therapy and also while excluding it with the aim to collect research data.





What new I have learned during my mobility



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I had a great opportunity to work with new technologies such as a new generation of microinfusory (pump insulin therapy). Thereat, I have learnt to manage to fix and correct dosages of different kinds of insulin







I had a chance to visit the museum of the Department of Anatomy of the University of Pisa. A notable feature of this visit was the familiarization with modern anatomical drugs that provide detailed information in 3D format. This provides an opportunity for students and visitors to directly study all organs in a living organism, thereby broadening the horizon of clinical thinking







Language barrier can be the main cause of problems for studies abroad. Erasmus students often take part in courses which they can improve their language level and I had a wonderful chance to take free lessons of Italian and have successfully completed the beginners course. Attending this course was very useful not only in terms of learning the basics of Italian language, but also created a wonderful opportunity to meet new people from various parts of the world and indulge into multicultural environment





Also it should be emphasized that Erasmus have given me the opportunity to travel around Italian cities. With 48.6 million tourists a year Italy is the fifth most visited country in international tourism.
