Defining European Union studies

"European Union studies comprises the study of Europe in its entirety, with a particular emphasis on the EU dimension, from an internal but also from a global perspective"

Enhancing awareness of the European Union:

- European citizenship and values
- Role of the EU in a globalised world
- Facilitating future engagement as well as people-to-people dialogue.
- Vector of **public diplomacy in third countries**, promoting **EU values** and enhancing the visibility of the European Union
- Scope of EU studies may vary so long as an EU angle is explored.

Jean Monnet Actions in the field of Higher Education

JEAN MONNET ACTIONS FOR HIGHER EDUCATION: AIMS

- To promote excellence in teaching and research in EU studies worldwide
- To foster dialogue between academic world and society ⇒ policymakers, civil servants, civil society, representatives of different levels of education, the media
- To generate knowledge and insights in support of EU policy-making & strengthen the role of the EU within Europe and the world
- To reach out to a wider public (beyond academia and specialized audiences) ⇒ bringing EU knowledge closer to society
- To function as vector for public diplomacy towards partner/third countries ⇒ promoting EU values and enhancing the visibility of what the EU stands for and what it wants to achieve.

Project title: Society, Culture, and Social Change in Europe: interdisciplinary direction on different areas in social, cultural and political affairs in Europe.

Duration: 2017-2020

Discipline: multidisciplinaire - Social dialogue, EU Citizenship, EU awareness and Democracy, Ethics, religion and philosophy (incl. Inter-religious dialogue)

Aim: Transfers of knowledge, focus of organized activities, links with policy-relevant issues, primarily in relation to the EU's role in the globalized world

Jean Monnet Policy Debate

Large thematic networks in Higher Education in order to collect, share and discuss among the partners research findings, content of courses and experiences, products (studies, articles, etc.).

The coordinator of the network: select most innovative and interesting results to be provided to the Commission.

- A) Network on internal EU issues shall address the following thematic: "Future of Europe"
- B) Network on foreign policy issues shall address the following thematic: "Europe in the world"

<u>Aim:</u> provide regular feedback (e.g. an online newsletter) on the most advanced and innovative practices in the field, supporting and adding value to the debate.

Any HEI in the world - Exception: organisations from Belarus are not eligible to participate in these actions.

Participating organisations:

Any higher education institution established in a EU Member State, third country associated to the Programme or third country not associated to the Programme can submit an application, Exception: organisations from Belarus (Region 2) are not eligible to participate in this action.

- a) Network on internal EU issues: a minimum of 12 higher education institutions from 7 different EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme.
- b) Network on foreign policy issues: a minimum of 12 higher education institutions with at least 6 participants from third countries not associated to the Programme and funded by EU external action instruments.

The final aim of the thematic networks is to provide regular feedback (e.g. an online newsletter) on the most advanced and innovative practices in the field, supporting and adding value to the debate.





Award Criteria – Jean Monnet activities

- Slight differences between the Jean Monnet actions.
- To be considered for funding, proposals must **score at least 70/100** points in total and **15/25 points in each award criterion**
- Relevance of the project (maximum 25/100 points)
- Quality of the project design and implementation (maximum 25/100 points)
- Quality of the partnership and cooperation arrangements (maximum 25/100 points)
- Impact, dissemination and sustainability (maximum 25/100 points)

Deadline for submission of applications	1 March 2022
Evaluation period	April – June 2022
Notification of results to applicants	max. 6 months after submission deadline
Preparation of Grant Agreement/Decision	max. 9 months after submission deadline



- ✓ **Be coherent**: avoid contradictions and "cut and paste" style applications
- ✓ <u>Be concrete</u>: use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence
- ✓ <u>Be clear</u>: read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form
- ✓ <u>Be explicit</u>: take nothing for granted; don't assume that experts have prior knowledge; avoid abbreviations or explain them
- ✓ <u>Be realistic</u>: the application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign
- ✓ <u>Remain focused</u>: concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you
- ✓ Eligibility: make sure you have followed all instructions and that the proposal meets all mandatory requirements
- ✓ <u>Keep it simple</u>: use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused
