Findings and Conclusions

Impact of projects at the national level:

- Ongoing wide introduction of the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) in all HEIs of Uzbekistan.
- Significant impact of Erasmus+ projects on the introduction of new methods of quality management in education
- The system of continuous professional development of management personnel in HE system
- New joint curricula on a bilateral basis with European partners
