Jean Monnet : 2021 Defining European Union Studies

" European Union studies comprises the study of Europe in its entirety, with a particular emphasis on the EU dimension, from an internal but also from a global perspective "



Enhancing awareness of the European Union:

- **European citizenship** and values
- Role of the **EU in a globalised world**
- Facilitating future engagement as well as **people-to-people dialogue.**
- Vector of **public diplomacy in third countries**, promoting EU values and enhancing the visibility of the European Union
- Scope of EU studies may vary so long **as an EU angle is explored.**

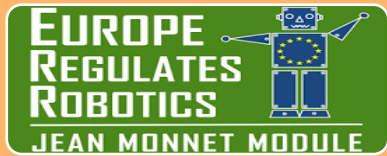


I. JEAN MONNET ACTIONS FOR HIGHER EDUCATION: AIMS

- To promote excellence in teaching and research in EU studies worldwide
- To foster dialogue between academic world and society ➔ policymakers, civil servants, civil society, representatives of different levels of education, the media
- To generate knowledge and insights in support of EU policy-making & strengthen the role of the EU within Europe and the world
- To reach out to a wider public (beyond academia and specialised audiences) ➔ bringing EU knowledge closer to society
- To function as vector for public diplomacy towards partner/third countries ➔ promoting EU values and enhancing the visibility of what the EU stands for and what it wants to achieve.

I. JEAN MONNET ACTIONS IN THE FIELD OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Aim: support teaching and research in the field of European Union studies worldwide.



MODULES: Short teaching programmes in EU studies taught at a HE institution. May be mono or multidisciplinary and may call upon the academic input of several professors and experts. Minimum: 40 teaching hrs programs.



CHAIRS: Teaching posts with a specialisation in European Union studies for university professors. Minimum: 90 teaching hrs taught by Chair holder.

Held by one professor ONLY, but with possible team to support and enhance the activities of the Chair, including provision of additional teaching hours.



CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE: focal points of competence and knowledge on European Union subjects. They should seek to:

- * gather expertise and competences of high-level experts, aiming to develop synergies between various disciplines and resources in EU studies, and develop joint transnational activities.

- * widen outreach: to students from faculties not normally exposed to European Union issues, policy makers, civil servants, etc.

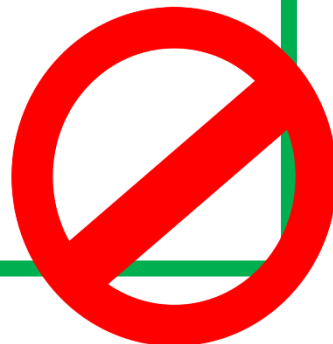

- Amounts provided in tables \Rightarrow indicate final eligible EU contribution

Core Rules

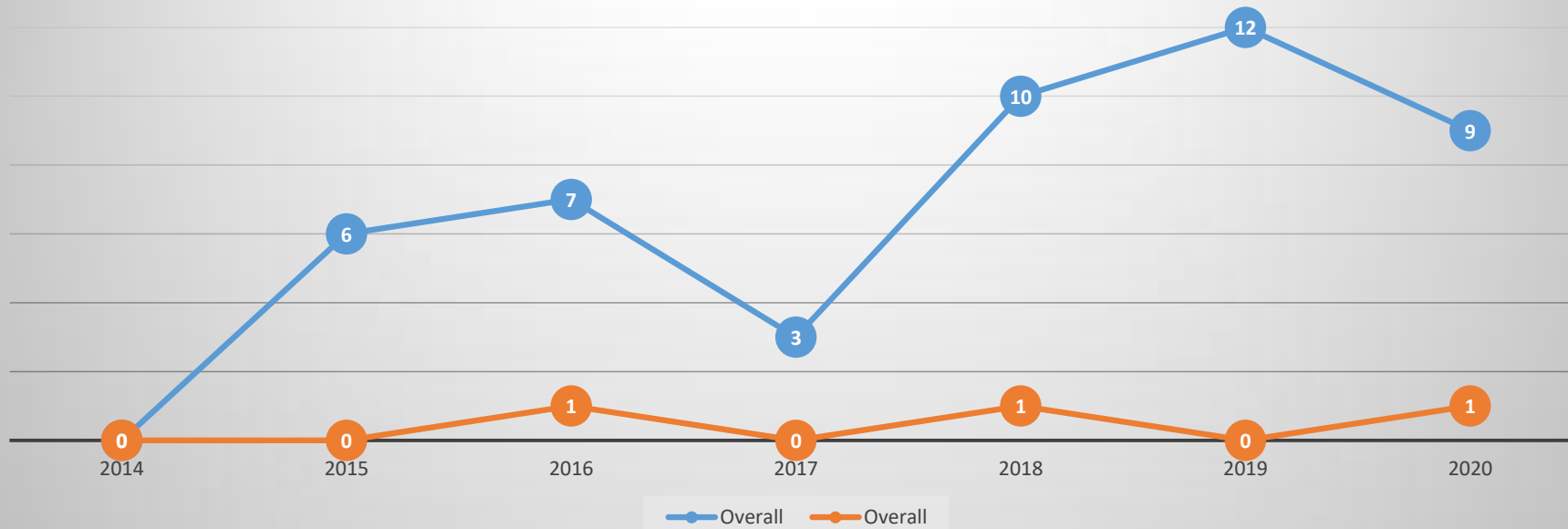
- Amount of single lump sum contribution determined for each grant ➡ based on the estimated budget proposed by applicant
- Granting authority will fix lump sum per grant ➡ based on proposal, evaluation result, funding rates and maximum grant amount set in Call.

Details

- Budget presented as detailed & coherent work packages
- Activities for each work package must be outlined in detail
- Applicants must provide breakdown of estimated costs showing the share per work package
- Typology of costs: staff, travel and subsistence, equipment, subcontracting, other.

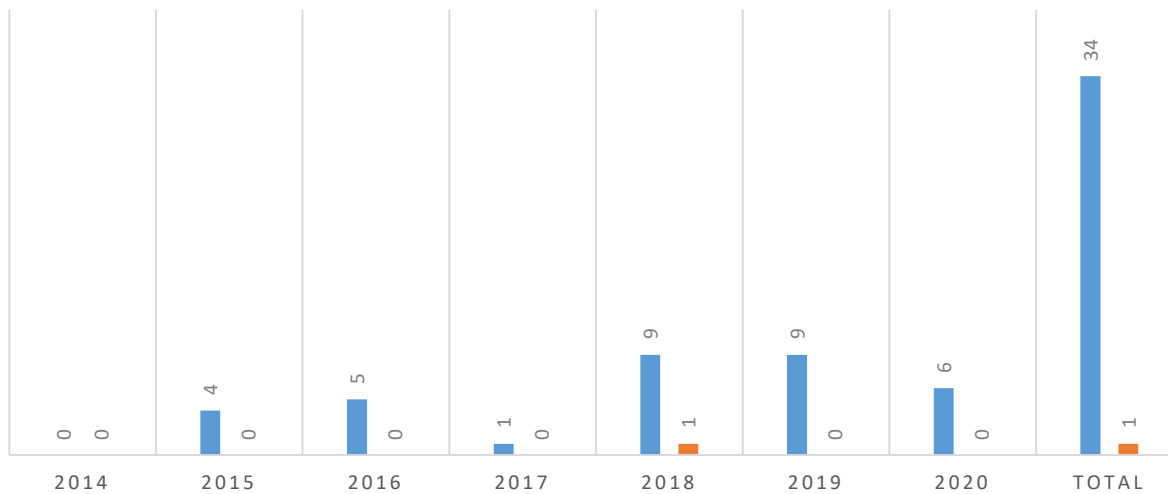

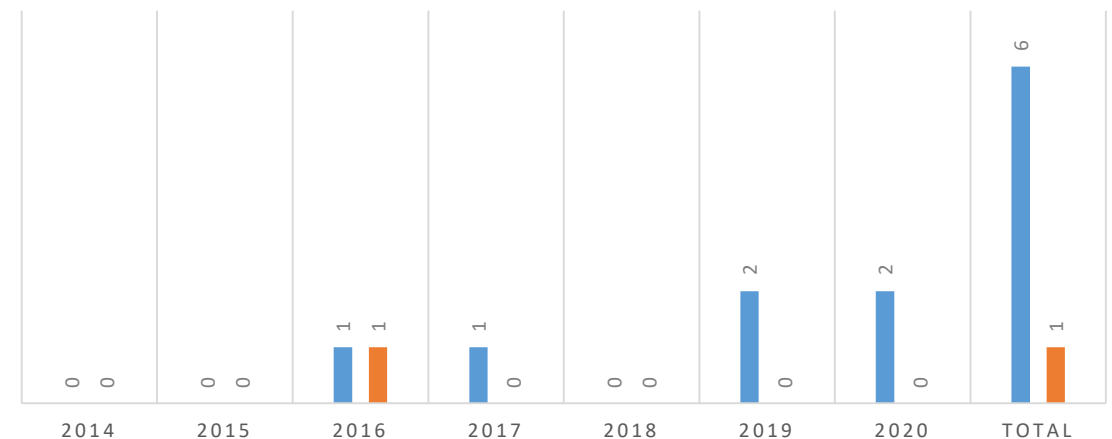

Jean Monnet 2020 - All Countries





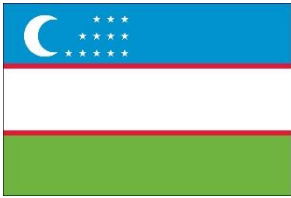

Read attentively Call requirements → do not leave blank any parts of application form

How to draft a good application

- ✓ **Be coherent**: avoid contradictions and “cut and paste” style applications.
- ✓ **Be concrete**: use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence.
- ✓ **Be clear**: read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form.
- ✓ **Be explicit**: take nothing for granted; don't assume that experts have prior knowledge; avoid abbreviations or explain them.
- ✓ **Be realistic**: the application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign.
- ✓ **Remain focused**: concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you.
- ✓ **Eligibility**: Make sure you have followed all instructions and that the proposal meets all mandatory requirements.
- ✓ **Keep it simple**: Use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused.



Tips for a successful Jean Monnet application

To construct a successful Jean Monnet bid make sure that ...

- The **EU angle** is evident in the proposal's content
- All combined elements will lead to **concrete & sustainable results** to the benefit of all Project stakeholders
- It is prepared and **consensuated** with all team members / partners
- It bears the **institutional support** of the legal representative
- You can be **ready to start** as soon as you are notified that the bid was successful.





The European Union Institutions appoint external experts to assist in the evaluation of grant applications, projects and tenders, and to provide opinions and advice in specific cases.



In particular, experts assist in:

- **Evaluation** of proposals, prize applications and tenders
- **Monitoring** of actions, grant agreements, public procurement contracts

In addition, experts provide opinion and advise on:

- **Preparation, implementation and evaluation of EU programmes and design of policies.**

In order to select experts, the European Union Institutions publish regularly calls for expression of interest (see list below) detailing the selection criteria, the required expertise, the description of the tasks, their duration and the conditions of remuneration.
